Mini Project: Landform Challenges - A Newspaper Investigation

Mission Brief:

You are a **journalist** for a major environmental newspaper. Your task is to investigate a landform area facing critical environmental challenges. Research the issues the region is facing, propose realistic solutions to these challenges, and write a newspaper article informing the public about the problem and how it can be solved. This article will be published for the public to read and understand how environmental issues can be addressed.

Project Guidelines:

Step 1: Choose Your Landform Area

Select a landform from the following categories and pick a specific region where it is facing an environmental challenge. You may research online or refer to resources provided in class.

- Plateau: (e.g., Tibetan Plateau, Colorado Plateau)
- Valley: (e.g., Nile Valley, San Fernando Valley)
- Hill: (e.g., Hollywood Hills, Appalachian Mountains)
- Mountain: (e.g., Andes Mountains, Alps)
- Volcano: (e.g., Mount Vesuvius, Mount Fuji)
- Coastline: (e.g., Florida Keys, Great Barrier Reef)

Step 2: Investigate the Challenges

Research the specific **environmental challenges** that the chosen landform area is currently facing. Some challenges to consider:

- Urban sprawl
